CHAPTER 8

An Act to amend The Municipal Board Act

(Assented to December 22, 1991)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Short title **1 This Act may be cited as The Municipal Board Amendment Act, 1991.**

2 The Municipal Board Act is amended in the manner set forth in this Act.

Section 4 amended **3(1) Subsection 4(1) is repealed and the following substituted:**

“(1) The Lieutenant Governor in Council may appoint persons who possess the qualifications prescribed in this Act and the regulations to be full-time or part-time members of the board”.

(2) Subsections 4(7) and (8) are repealed and the following substituted:

“(7) A member of the board holds office at the pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor in Council.

“(8) A member may be suspended by the Lieutenant Governor in Council at any time and another person may be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor in Council to act in place of the suspended member”.

Section 11 amended **4 Subsection 11(1) is amended by striking out “The board shall” and substituting “The board may”.**

Section 78 amended **5 Section 78 is amended by adding the following clause after clause (g):**

“(g.1) prescribing the qualifications to be possessed by any person to be eligible to be appointed a full-time member or part-time member of the board”.

Amended provisions apply also to existing members

6 Notwithstanding section 4 of The Municipal Board Act, as it existed on the day immediately before the coming into force of this Act, or anything in any other Act or law or in the appointments of the members of the Saskatchewan Municipal Board who hold office at the time of the coming into force of this Act, section 4 of The Municipal Board Act, as amended by subsection 3(2) of this Act, also applies to the full-time members and part-time members of the Saskatchewan Municipal Board who hold office as members at the time of the coming into force of this Act.

Coming into force **7(1) Subject to subsection (2), this Act comes into force on the day of assent.**

(2) Section 4 comes into force on the day of assent but is retroactive and is deemed to have been in force on and from October 1, 1988.
