The Oil and Gas Conservation Act

STEELMAN MIDALE BEDS POOL — STEELMAN FROBISHER BEDS POOL

MRO 124/95 PO 9. Pursuant to section 17 of *The Oil and Gas Conservation Act*, MRO 63/81 PO 15, dated October 30, 1981, is rescinded and the following provisions shall apply to the drilling of, and the production of oil and gas from, vertical oil wells in the Steelman Midale Beds Pool and the Steelman Frobisher Beds Pool, effective March 1, 1995:

1 The drainage unit shall be comprised of two legal subdivisions in a Section grouped as follows:

legal subdivisions 1 and 2; 3 and 4; 5 and 6; 7 and 8; 9 and 10; 11 and 12; 13 and 14; 15 and 16.

2 Within a drainage unit, the sides of the target area shall be located 100 m from and parallel to the corresponding sides of the odd-numbered legal subdivisions

3 If a well is not completed within the target area, the minister may reduce the area used as a factor in determining the MARP.

4(a) For the first well drilled in each Section, the operator shall submit samples of the interval from the top of the Second White Specks to total depth.

(b) For all subsequent wells drilled in each Section, the operator shall submit samples of the interval from the top of the Paleozoic strata to total depth if such wells are intended to be drilled below the top of the Bakken Formation.

5 As a minimum requirement, the operator shall run logs to determine the resistivity, spontaneous potential, porosity and gamma ray spectra from surface casing shoe to total depth for each well drilled.
