ORDER IN COUNCIL

The Urban Municipality Act, 1984

[O.C. 553/2000] 6 September 2000

TO THE HONOURABLE

THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL

The undersigned has the honour to report that:

- 1 Section 12 of *The Urban Municipality Act, 1984,* provides, in part, as follows:
 - 12(1) On the recommendation of the minister, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may, by order, dissolve a ... village:
 - (a) if the council of the ... village, by resolution, requests it be dissolved, or there is a failure to elect a council;
 - (3) An order made pursuant to subsection (1) is to provide for the inclusion in a rural municipality of the area that has ceased to be a ... village.
 - (4) An order dissolving a ... village may appoint one or more persons to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the ... village and, if any such appointments are made, is to specify the remuneration payable to them.
 - (5) Subject to the other provisions of this Act and to any directions that may be specified in a dissolution order, the persons appointed pursuant to subsection (4) shall sell, dispose of and convert into money sufficient assets of the ... village to liquidate its liabilities and to pay their own remuneration as fixed by the order, and shall dispose of any remaining assets as directed by the minister.
 - (7) When an order dissolving a ... village is made:
 - (a) the members of the council and all the employees of the ... village cease to have any further authority;
 - (b) all taxes and revenues due to the former ... village are deemed to be taxes and revenues due to the rural municipality in which the ... village is included;
 - (c) all rights of action and actions by or against the former ... village may be commenced, continued or maintained by or against the rural municipality in which the ... village is included;
 - (d) all land and improvements vested in the former ... village is vested in the rural municipality in which the ... village is included, and, subject to any trusts or other conditions that may be applicable, may be dealt with by it in its own name: and
 - (e) ... all other assets, liabilities, rights, duties, functions and obligations of the former ... village are vested in the rural municipality in which the ... village is included and may be dealt with by it in its own name.
- **2** The 1996 census taken pursuant to the *Statistics Act* (Canada) determined that the Village of Glentworth has a population of 88.
- ${\bf 3}\,$ By resolution dated February 8, 2000 the Council of the Village of Glentworth requested that the village be dissolved.
- **4** It is deemed appropriate and in the public interest to dissolve the Village of Glentworth.

The undersigned, has the honour, therefore, to recommend that Your Honour's Order do issue pursuant to section 12 of *The Urban Municipality Act, 1984*:

- (a) dissolving the Village of Glentworth and including its area within the Rural Municipality of Waverley No. 44;
- (b) confirming that the dissolution shall take effect on and from the date this order is signed;
- (c) appointing Helen M. Cowan of Eston, Saskatchewan, to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the Village of Glentworth; and

(d) determining the remuneration payable to Helen M. Cowan to be \$15.00 per hour of work, and \$0.3346 per travelled kilometre and reimbursement of related miscellaneous expenses.

No. 6/00. The Saskatchewan Pulse Crop Development Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Pulse Crop Development Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act*, being cA-15.2 of the *Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1990-91*, as amended by the *Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1992*, c42, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 2 That from and after the effective date of this order, every producer who sells pulses to another producer shall pay a levy of 0.5% of the gross value of the pulses sold by deducting such levy from the payment received from that other producer and forwarding it to the Board.
- **3** A buyer who forwards a levy to the Board pursuant to paragraph 1 or a producer who forwards a levy to the Board pursuant to paragraph 2, shall forward to the Board with the levy a statement setting out the amount of the levy along with the name and full mailing address of the producer paying the levy no later than the 20th day of the month following the month in which the pulses sold.
- 4 Board Order No. 5/89 Levy Collection, effective December 31, 1989, is hereby revoked.

Order No. 6/00 is made pursuant to clauses 7(c), (d) and section 15 of *The Pulse Crop Development Plan Regulations* and shall be effective on, from and after the 7^{th} day of September, 2000, by order of the Saskatchewan Pulse Crop Development Board.

The Medical Profession Act, 1981

COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS OF SASKATCHEWAN — REGULATORY BYLAW AMENDMENTS

BYLAW 52

Bylaw 52 of the Bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan is amended by deleting paragraphs 52(4), (13), (14) and (17) and substituting the following:

- 4 No physician shall practice chelation therapy unless:
 - (a) That physician is certified by the American Board of Chelation Therapy or any other body acceptable to Council; or
 - (b) That physician has passed the written examination of the American Board of Chelation Therapy, the International Board of Chelation therapy or other body acceptable to the Council, and less than two years have passed since passing the written examination.
- 13 All physicians who wish to practice chelation therapy shall, as a condition of doing so, sign an undertaking in which they agree that:
 - (a) They will practice chelation therapy in accordance with the bylaws and protocols of the College as they exist from time to time:
 - (b) Their practice may be subject to audit or review in accordance with the bylaws and the protocols of the College as they exist from time to time;
 - (c) They will co-operate with any such audits or reviews;
 - (d) They will comply with any directions of the Council made pursuant to the paragraph 15 of this bylaw; and
 - (e) The Council retains the right to revoke its authorization to practice chelation therapy if the Council concludes that chelation therapy is ineffective and/or produces unacceptable risks to patients or for any other reason should not be practiced by physicians in Saskatchewan.
- 14 The Council may at any time appoint a physician to conduct an audit of a physician's chelation practice to report whether in that physician's opinion the physician practicing chelation therapy is complying with the standards of this bylaw and any protocols which may be established by the Council from time to time.
- 17 It is unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct for a physician to:
 - (a) Practice chelation therapy, otherwise than in accordance with the terms of this bylaw and the protocols which may be established from time to time by the College of Physicians and Surgeons:
 - (b) Fail to fully co-operate with an audit or review referred to in paragraph 14 or 15 of this bylaw;
 - (c) Practice chelation therapy in a manner inconsistent with a restriction or order made by the Council pursuant to clause 15(b) of this bylaw.

BYLAW 54

The bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons are amended by adding the following as Bylaw 54:

MAINTENANCE OF INSURANCE

- 1 In order to be granted a licence, or renew a licence, to practice as a regular member–active, as a provisional member–active, as a special member, a senior life-member–active or in order to be granted a *locum tenens* permit a physician shall:
 - (a) provide a written authorization to the College of Physicians and Surgeons in which the physician authorizes Canadian Medical Protective Association, or any insurer with whom the physician maintains professional liability insurance, to release to the College of Physicians and Surgeons any information respecting the status of that physician's membership or insurance coverage that may be required by the College of Physicians and Surgeons; and
 - (b) if the physician has been registered with the College immediately prior to the application for a licence or permit, or, although not registered with the College, has membership in the Canadian Medical Protective Association or is insured under a contract of malpractice insurance, provide proof that the physician either:
 - (i) is registered with Canadian Medical Protective Association as a member of that organization; or
 - (ii) is insured under a contract of malpractice insurance with an insurance company registered to do business in Saskatchewan that provides a minimum coverage of two million dollars for each occurrence; or
 - (c) if the physician has not been registered with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan immediately prior to the application for a licence or permit, or has been registered under an inactive licence, enter into an undertaking with the College of Physicians and Surgeons that:
 - (i) the physician will obtain membership with Canadian Medical Protective Association or maintain malpractice insurance with an insurance company registered to do business in Saskatchewan that provides a minimum coverage of two million dollars for each occurrence before beginning medical practice; and
 - (ii) the physician will provide proof of membership or insurance to the College of Physicians and Surgeons within a period of 30 days; and
 - (d) enter into an undertaking with the College of Physicians and Surgeons that the physician will continuously maintain membership with Canadian Medical Protective Association or maintain malpractice insurance with an insurance company registered to do business in Saskatchewan that provides a minimum coverage of two million dollars for each occurrence while the physician remains licensed or authorized to practice under a permit.
- 2 A physician who:
 - (a) does not provide medical care to patients in Saskatchewan; or
 - (b) practices exclusively with the Armed Forces of Canada; or

- (c) practices exclusively as an employee of an employer who maintains insurance coverage that includes insurance coverage that insures the physician against professional malpractice with an insurance company registered to do business in Saskatchewan that provides a minimum of two million dollars for each occurrence; or
- (d) provides information to the Registrar that satisfies the Registrar that the Saskatchewan public would not be placed unduly at risk if the physician were not required to maintain insurance coverage or membership in the Canadian Medical Protective Association:

may apply to the College of Physicians and Surgeons for exemption from the requirement that the physician be a member of the Canadian Medical Protective Association or be covered by a policy of insurance. The application for an exemption shall be accompanied by an undertaking that the physician will immediately obtain membership with Canadian Medical Protective Association or obtain malpractice insurance with an insurance company registered to do business in Saskatchewan that provides a minimum coverage of two million dollars for each occurrence if the physician should cease to meet the conditions of paragraph (a), (b) or (c), or if any of the information provided in an application under paragraph (d) should cease to be accurate.

3 It is unbecoming, improper, unprofessional, or discreditable conduct for a physician to breach an undertaking provided to the College pursuant to this paragraph.

PROFESSIONAL CORPORATIONS

- ${\bf 1}\ An applicant for registration by a Professional Corporation, or an applicant for renewal of a permit by a Professional Corporation shall file with the College Form "A" to these bylaws that:$
 - (a) is legible;
 - (b) contains all of the information required by the form;
 - (c) attaches all documents that are required by the form; and
 - (d) is signed by all persons required to sign the form.
- ${f 2}$ The Registrar may refuse registration, or refuse to renew a permit where the form is not completed in accordance with paragraph 1.
- **3** The Registrar may request additional information relating to an application for registration or an application for renewal of a permit by a professional corporation, and may refuse registration or renewal of a permit until that information is provided.
- **4** All advertising by Professional Corporations shall comply with the provisions of these bylaws pertaining to advertising by members.
- **5** Each member who practices medicine by, through or in the name of a Professional Corporation is responsible to ensure that all advertising by the Professional Corporation complies with the bylaws.

BYLAW 56

The bylaws of the College of Physicians and Surgeons are amended by adding the following as Bylaws 56:

COSTS OF DISCIPLINE PROCEEDINGS

- **1** For the purpose of clause 54(1)(i) of *The Medical Profession Act, 1981*, the following are defined to be costs of and incidental to the investigation and hearing:
 - (a) the travel, accommodation and meal expenses of the members of the discipline hearing committee for the hearing, as well as the per diem allowances payable by the College to such members for such hearing:
 - (b) the fees and expenses, including travel, accommodation and meal expenses of the assessor retained by College in connection with the hearing;
 - (c) the travel, accommodation and meal expenses of the members of the preliminary inquiry committee in connection with its investigation, as well as the per diem allowances payable by the College to such persons for such investigation;
 - (d) the cost of reporting services and expenses;
 - (e) expert fees both for the preparation of written opinions and attending to give evidence with travel, accommodation and meal expenses incurred by such expert witnesses for the purpose of giving evidence;
 - (f) payments made to witnesses in connection with a hearing before the discipline hearing committee or before the preliminary inquiry committee, including witness fees, travel and meal expenses;
 - (g) the fees and expenses of the lawyer or lawyers retained by College in connection with the investigation and/or hearing;
 - (h) the sum of \$150.00 per hour for each hour spent by a lawyer employed by the College of Physicians and Surgeons in connection with the investigation and/or hearing;
 - (i) costs of photocopying done by the College of Physicians and Surgeons in connection with the investigation and/or hearing calculated at a rate of \$.25 per page;
 - (j) any other expenses incurred by the College incidental to the investigation and hearing.

The Saskatchewan Applied Science Technologists and Technicians Act

SASKATCHEWAN APPLIED SCIENCE TECHNOLOGISTS AND TECHNICIANS — REGULATORY BYLAWS

1.0 TITLE

These Bylaws may be cited as The Saskatchewan Applied Science Technologists and Technicians Regulatory Bylaws.

2.0 DEFINITIONS

In the Bylaws, and in any policies made by the Board of Directors, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) "Act" means The Saskatchewan Applied Science Technologists and Technicians Act;
- (b) "applied science/engineering technology" means the application of technical knowledge and skills, performing work, and providing services of a technological nature carried on in the practice of applied science/engineering technology:
 - (i) that are in the field of engineering technology or applied science technology in which the engineering technologist or technician or applied science technologist or certified technician is acceptably qualified, trained, and experienced; and

- (ii) that apply mathematical or applied science principles and methods of technological problem solving that are in accordance with, but not limited to:
 - established and generally recognized codes and standards; or
- $-\mbox{generally}$ recognized procedures and practices; appropriate to the endeavor; or
- are based on plans, drawings or specifications; and
- (iii) that are in accordance with the engineering technologist's or technician's or applied science technologist's or certified technician's Code of Ethical Practice;
- (c) "Association" means the Association of The Saskatchewan Applied Science Technologists and Technicians, Inc. pursuant to section 3 of the Act;
 - (d) "Board" means the Board of Directors of the Association;
- (e) **"Director"** means an individual elected or appointed to the Board of Directors of the Association;
- (f) **"Executive Director"** means the person appointed pursuant to section 11 of the Administrative Bylaws;
- (g) **"ex-officio"** means an appointment by the Board to the Board, or to any committee of the Board, without voting privileges;
- (h) "lay board member" means a person who is appointed pursuant to the Board of Directors pursuant to section 8 of the Act:
- (i) "majority" means one more than half of the total number of all Directors on the SASTT Board;
 - (j) "member" refers to any of the following:
 - (i) "associate member" means a person in good standing who is working in the applied science/engineering technology profession and who has yet to achieve either the required work experience or academic qualifications to become a registered professional member;
 - (ii) **"registered professional member"** means a person who is a registered professional Applied Science Technologist or a registered professional Certified Technician in good standing:
 - (iii) "student member" means a person in good standing who is enrolled in a recognized or accredited applied science/engineering technologist or applied science/engineering technician program of study;
- (k) **"officers"** means the following individuals elected or appointed to positions of the SASTT: President, Immediate Past President, Vice President(s), Secretary, Treasurer, and Executive Director;
- (l) "policy" means a policy made by the Board of Directors;(m) "Registrar" means the person appointed pursuant to
- section 11 of the Administrative Bylaws;
- (n) "SASTT" shall be the abbreviated form of the name of

Any words importing the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine and vice versa wherever the context so requires.

3.0 MEMBERSHIP

3.1 General

Individuals in applied science/engineering technology are eligible for membership in the Association provided they meet the requirements for one of the membership categories listed below and they have satisfied the Association as to their moral fitness to become a member. All members must assume the responsibilities outlined in the Act, these Bylaws and the Association Code of Ethics to remain a member in good standing.

3.2 Application for Registration

An application for registration, including membership, transfer, reinstatement, reactivation, reclassification, or for any other category of membership identified herein, is considered as an application for registration. Applications shall be made to the Registrar on a form

provided by the Association for the stated purpose. All applicants shall submit official documentation of their academic and experiential qualifications. The applicant shall further provide a current detailed job description, properly endorsed by the applicant's employer or another individual acceptable to the Board, and submit any other relevant information upon request by the Registrar. The Registration, and Examination Boards will evaluate all applications in accordance with policies and procedures established by the Board.

3.3 Categories of Membership

The following categories of membership are established:

- (a) student member;
- (b) associate member;
- (c) registered professional members;
- (i) certified technician;
- (ii) applied science technologist;
- (d) life member;
- (e) retired member;
- (f) honourary member; and
- (g) temporary membership.

3.4 Membership Eligibility and Classification

- (a) Student Members Individuals who are enrolled as full-time students in a recognized or nationally accredited applied science or engineering technology program who have complied with the requirements of these Bylaws and established policy.
- - (i) are employed in the applied science or engineering technology community but who lack some of the required educational qualifications for registration of a registered professional member; or
 - (ii) have met all of the educational requirements for registration but lack the relevant experience required of a registered professional member.

Associate membership shall be issued and renewed at such intervals and subject to such conditions, limitations and restrictions as may be set out in policy established by the Board of Directors.

- (c) Registered Professional Members A registered professional member is one who has met both the required academic, and experiential qualifications established by the Board:
 - (i) Applied Science Technologist An Applied Science Technologist shall hold a diploma in an accredited or recognized applied science/engineering technology program from a Saskatchewan technical institute or equivalent courses from other recognized institutions, or satisfactory completion of examinations established by the Association's Examination Board; and provide evidence that he/she has a minimum of two years' progressive, work-related experience in their field of academic training. The applicant's experience shall be evaluated in accordance with the National Profile of an Applied Science Technologist and guidelines established by the Registration Board.
 - (ii) Certified Technician A Certified Technician shall hold a certificate in an accredited or recognized applied science/engineering technology program from a Saskatchewan technical institute or equivalent courses from other recognized institutions, or satisfactory completion of examinations established by the Association's Examination Board; and provide evidence that he/she has a minimum of two years' progressive, work-related experience in their field of academic training. The applicant's experience shall be evaluated in accordance with the National Profile of a Certified Technician and guidelines established by the Registration Board.

Once membership has been approved by the Registration Board, the Registrar shall notify the applicant of the appropriate category of membership in which the applicant has been registered.

(d) Life Members — Life membership may be awarded to members who have given exceptional and meritorious service to the Association or members who have completely retired from employment and meet specific criteria as outlined in Association policy. Life membership does not include those who have left applied science technology and are working in other fields. Life members are required to advise SASTT in writing upon returning to employment.

Life members shall be entitled to all the rights of registered professional members but shall be exempt from payment of annual fees, other than chapter fees, and subject to all other provisions of these Bylaws, and Association policies.

- (e) Retired Members Retired membership may be awarded to members who are have retired from the applied science and engineering technology profession and meet specific criteria as outlined in Association policy. Retired does not include those who have left applied science or engineering technology and are working in other fields. Retired members are required to advise SASTT in writing upon returning to employment in the applied science or engineering technology profession.
- (f) Honourary Members Honourary membership may be awarded to persons who are highly esteemed in their fields of endeavor or have furthered the interests and development, advancement, and welfare of the applied science/engineering technology profession in an outstanding manner.

At the discretion of the Board of Directors, honourary members may use the applicable professional designation "A.Sc.T." or "C.Tech." and shall be entitled to all membership rights and benefits of registered professional members without payment of annual fees, other than chapter fees, and subject to all other provisions of the Act, Bylaws, and Association policies.

(g) Temporary Registration — Any member who is registered with a provincial association belonging to the Canadian Council of Technicians and Technologists or any other association recognized by the Board of Directors and requiring temporary registration while practicing applied science/engineering technology in Saskatchewan may be granted membership at the appropriate classification under such circumstances, conditions, limitations, and restrictions and for such temporary and limited periods of time as established by the Board of Directors.

3.5 Registration Certificates

A certificate of registration shall be issued to all registered professional and associate members and shall be appropriately displayed. Certificates of registration remain the property of the Association and shall be returned to the Association immediately upon demand by the Registrar.

4.0 MAINTENANCE OF MEMBERSHIP

In order to maintain his or her registration as a member, a member shall pay the prescribed fee for annual membership, and a member who fails to pay that fee on or before the required date for payment ceases to be a member.

4.1 Resignations

- (a) Any member may resign by giving written notice to the Registrar. To resign in good standing a member shall have paid all dues, fees or levies which were due and payable by him or her to the Association at the time of resignation.
- (b) Upon resignation, a member shall forfeit any implied or given right to use or display the professional seal, membership certificate or professional ring, and shall be notified of the acceptance and terms of the resignation together with the limitations or reinstatement, in writing.

4.2 Reinstatement of Membership

(a) Any member removed or expelled from the register may, upon application within one (1) year of removal or expulsion, be reinstated to membership upon payment of outstanding dues, assessments, and charges, including current reinstatement fees, provided all current membership requirements are met.

- (b) Any former member seeking reinstatement after more than a one (1) year lapse of membership will be treated as a new applicant, having his or her qualifications assessed against current requirements. When such an application for reinstatement is made in a subsequent calendar year, the fees payable shall be in an amount equal to the fees that should have been paid in respect of the year in which the person ceased to be a member, and the current year's fees, plus a penalty fee in an amount equivalent to that of the registration of a new member.
- (c) An application for reinstatement of membership from an applicant who has been suspended or expelled from the Association by the Board of Directors for disciplinary reasons shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for review. Such applicant may be reinstated only upon terms and conditions as decided by the Board of Directors.
- (d) Applications for membership, reinstatement or reactivation from persons that have been found guilty of an offense by a Court shall be submitted to the Board of Directors for review. Such applicant may be accepted, reinstated or reactivated only upon terms and conditions as decided by the Board of Directors.

4.3 Reactivation of Membership

- (a) A former member who has resigned and is not indebted to the Association may apply for reactivation of membership in accordance with these Bylaws and policies as established by the Board of Directors, provided he or she applies for reactivation of membership within one (1) year of his or her initial resignation.
- (b) Any former member seeking reactivation after more than one (1) year will be treated as a new applicant, having his or her qualifications assessed against current requirements.

4.4 Expulsion for Non-Payment

A member who has not paid all outstanding dues and assessments by the respective date established in Policy by the Board of Directors shall be deleted from the register for non-payment of dues. He or she shall be sent a notice to the last known address on the Association's file which advises him or her that he or she is no longer entitled to any of the rights and privileges of membership nor may he or she hold himself or herself out as a member, and he or she must immediately return all Association property such as membership certificates, professional seal, etc. to the Association's headquarters. Members deleted from the register shall also forfeit any implied or given right to wear or display the professional ring.

When a member is removed from the Association register, the Association may inform his/her employer that he/she is no longer a member.

The names of people who have relinquished their membership may be published in the Association newsletter.

4.5 Proof of Competency

Members may be required by the Board of Directors to undergo periodic examinations or submit further information relating to their competency for the purpose of maintaining membership in the Association.

5.0 LICENCES

5.1 Licences Required

- 1 All members are required to obtain an annual, restricted or temporary licence of registration, as the case may be, by submitting the required form provided by the Association, together with the required fee before the required date in each year.
- **2** A member who is retired or not working in Saskatchewan may apply to the Board of Directors to waive the requirement to obtain a licence while the member is retired or not working in Saskatchewan.
- **3** A member who does not obtain a licence or a waiver in accordance with subsections (1) and (2) by the required date of each year ceases to be a member.

5.2 Annual Licence

- 1 An annual licence is available to a registered professional member or a temporary member.
- 2 An annual licence provided to a registered professional member entitles the member to use the professional designation awarded by the Registration Board.

5.3 Temporary Licence

A temporary licence is available to a person of good character who is not a member, but is entitled to benefits of a temporary licence under the North American Free Trade Agreement.

6.0 ASSOCIATION BOARDS

6.1 Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall govern and regulate:

- (i) the admission, suspension, expulsion, removal, discipline, and reinstatement of members, the conditions precedent to membership in the Association, and the conditions for continued membership in the Association;
- (ii) the registration and renewal, suspension, cancellation, and reinstatement of registration of applied science/engineering technologists, and applied science/engineering technicians, including the imposition of limitations, restrictions and conditions on any registration issued or granted pursuant to these Bylaws;
- (iii) the number of membership categories, and determine the rights, privileges, and obligations of the members of each category;
- (iv) such other subjects, matters and things as the Board of Directors considers appropriate to administer these Bylaws or to advance or protect the interests of the public, Association or its members.

6.2 Accreditation, Examination, and Registration BoardsThe Board of Directors shall establish the following Boards:

(a) Accreditation Board — The Accreditation Board shall review educational programs by a periodic review process. The Accreditation Board shall operate in conjunction with the Canadian Technology Accreditation Board established by The Canadian Council of Technicians and Technologists.

The Accreditation Board shall assist the Registration Board when called upon.

The Accreditation Board shall be responsible for the consistency of its decisions, the publication of its findings, and the submission of written reports on its activities to each meeting of the Board of Directors.

The Accreditation Board reports to the Registration Board.

(b) Examination Board — The Examination Board shall review all applications for registration from individuals who attained their academic training from programs that the Accreditation Board has not previously evaluated.

The Examination Board shall make recommendations on the academic qualification of each application against the current Canadian Technology Standards for Applied Science/Engineering Technologies.

The Examination Board reports to the Registration Board.

 $Specific \, criteria \, on \, the \, Examination \, Board's \, structure, \, tenure, \, meetings, \, \, duties, \, \, and \, \, objectives \, \, shall \, \, be \, \, established \, \, in \, \, Association \, Policy.$

- (c) Registration Board The Registration Board shall review the academic, and experiential qualifications for all members assessing each against current Canadian Technology Standards. The Registration Board may:
 - (i) approve the registration;
 - (ii) refuse the registration; or
 - (iii) defer the approval of registration until it is satisfied that the applicant has complied with the requirements established within the Registration Board's Policy.

The Board may, in its discretion, require an applicant for registration:

- (a) to pass one (1) or more examinations established by the Examination Board;
- (b) to obtain more experience of a kind satisfactory to the Registration Board for a period set by the Registration Board; or
- (c) both (a) and (b) above, before approving the registration.

The Registration Board shall have the power to appoint sub-boards and sub-committees responsible to the Registration Board and to delegate such responsibility and authority of the Registration Board needed to carry out the specific function of the appointed sub-board or sub-committee.

The Registration Board shall assume responsibility for consistency of decisions made by the Examination Board.

The Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may confirm, vary or reverse the decision of the Registration Board.

Specific criteria on the Registration Board's structure, tenure, meetings, duties, and objectives shall be established in Association Policy.

7.0 Applications to Review Decisions of the Registrar

An applicant, who feels that the decision of the Registrar respecting an application for registration or licensure is unjust, may forward a written request to the Registrar outlining the reasons why he or she feels the decision is in error. The Registrar will then request the Registration Board to undertake a second review of the applicant's file

In the event the Registration Board concurs with their previous decision and the applicant still considers such unacceptable, he or she may file an application to review the final decision of the Registrar to the Board of Directors within thirty (30) days. The application shall be a written request in the form of a letter to the Board of Directors, setting out the grounds on which the applicant alleges that the Registrar's decision is in error, together with any documentation necessary to support the allegation.

The Board of Directors' shall provide an applicant for review with an opportunity to make a verbal presentation to the Board, if desired by the applicant, as soon as possible after the application is received.

8.0 PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

8.1 Code of Ethics

- 1 All members shall recognize the Code of Ethics as a set of enduring principles guiding their conduct and way of life and shall conduct themselves in an honorable and ethical manner, upholding the values of truth, honesty and trustworthiness, and shall safeguard human life and welfare and the environment.
- 2 The Association's Code of Ethics shall be binding on all members. Complaints regarding a member's breach of the Code of Ethics will be dealt with by the Discipline Committee.
- $\boldsymbol{3}$ The Association's Code of Ethics is attached hereto as Appendix D.

9.0 PRACTICE OF APPLIED SCIENCE/ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY

9.1 Practice of Applied Science/Engineering Technology

A registered professional member may provide services or carry on work in accordance with his or her academic qualifications, training and experience in all fields of applied science/engineering technology designated by the Board of Directors.

9.2 Professional Designations

Members in good standing who have been registered or awarded Applied Science Technologist status may use the professional designation "A.Sc. T." following their name within the Province of Saskatchewan. Members in good standing who have been registered or awarded Certified Technician status may use the professional designation "C. Tech." following their name within the Province of Saskatchewan.

9.3 Disciplines of Registration

Individuals practicing applied science/engineering technology in disciplines and fields outlined in Appendix E may be entitled to membership in the Association providing they meet the academic, and experiential requirements for registration.

9.4 Standards of Practice for Members

In the provision of such work or services, a member shall at all times adhere to all standards of professional practice as may be established by the Bylaws, and abide by federal, and provincial codes. A registered professional member will be accountable and accept responsibility for all services he or she performs.

- (a) All members are bound to conduct themselves in accordance with the Association's Act, Code of Ethics, and Bylaws, and respond promptly to all communications from the Association.
- (b) Each member shall endeavor to promote the interests of the Association and to carry out the objectives of the Association.

9.5 Professional Identification Seal

- (a) Issuance Three years after the date of registration as an Applied Science Technologist or Certified Technician, members are eligible to apply to the Association for a professional identification seal. The professional identification seal issued to Applied Science Technologists or Certified Technicians shall remain the property of the Association. In the event a person ceases to remain a member-in-good standing or is suspended from the Association, the professional identification seal must be returned upon written request from the Registrar.
- (b) Design All professional seals must be acquired from the Association headquarters in a format prescribed in Appendix F.
- (c) Manner of Use Every Applied Science Technologist or Certified Technician registered with SASTT are entitled, in accordance with these Bylaws, to sign and seal all final drawings, specifications, plans, reports, and other documents and designs relating to the practice of applied science/engineering technology that he or she issues, prepares or approves. The member under whose direct technical supervision documents are prepared shall affix his or her professional seal in a prominent location and shall sign and date it. The professional seal may only be affixed to documents prepared by a registered professional member or prepared under his or her direct supervision. Use of the professional seal is strictly limited to documents describing work or containing information that is within the scope of practice defined by the member's academic qualifications, training, experience, and in accordance with guidelines established by the Board.
- (d) Members Suspended A member who is expelled or suspended or whose membership is revoked shall return his or her professional seal to the Registrar for the period of the suspension, expulsion or revocation. The member shall return the professional seal to the Registrar within fourteen (14) days of notification. Upon removal of suspension, expulsion or revocation, the Association will return the professional seal to the member.

9.6 Advertising

A registered professional member who advertises his or her services shall at all times do so in a professional and factual manner without exaggeration. He or she shall not use the Association's corporate seal, logo or image thereof in any such advertising without the written consent of a SASTT officer.

10.0 DISCIPLINE

10.1 Investigation Committee

The Investigation Committee that the Board of Directors is required to appoint pursuant to section 22 of the Act shall consist of at least 3 members.

10.2 Discipline Committee

- 1 The Discipline Committee shall consist of at least 5 members who shall be appointed by the Board of Directors, in addition to the lay board member, who is required to be appointed by subsection 24(1) of the Act.
- 2 The Discipline Committee shall select its chair and vice-chair.
- **3** A person employed by the Association and assigned by the Executive Director shall serve as Secretary to the Discipline Committee and shall provide the committee with administrative support.
- **4** The Discipline Committee shall hear the complaint(s), and publish any rules that it adopts in accordance with section 24.3 of the Act and shall ensure that the published document is publicly available on request and without charge.

10.3 Illegal Use of Professional Designations

Any person authorized to use the professional designations of "A.Sc.T" or "C.Tech." and to hold himself or herself out as an Applied Science Technologist or Certified Technician pursuant to the provisions of the Act who carries on his or her practice in violation of any condition, limitation or restriction imposed upon his or her registration or who fails to inform his or her employer of such condition, limitation or restriction, shall be dealt with in accordance with the Act, and the Bylaws.

11.0 ELECTRONIC SERVICES OF NOTICES

Documents that are permitted by the Act and the Bylaws to be served on or given to a member, may be sent to the member electronically to the address in the records of the Association.

12.0 RULES, REGULATIONS AND POLICIES

The Board of Directors of the SASTT may create polices to deal with the conduct, operation, and administration of the Association's business and/or committees, boards, and registration requirements. Policies require a majority vote of the Board of Directors for passage and may not be inconsistent with the Act or these Bylaws. These rules, regulations and policies may be amended from time to time as the Board of Directors deems expedient.

13.0 PAYMENT OF EXPENSES

The reasonable out-of-pocket expenses of officers, Directors, and members of the Association acting on committees of the Association, incurred while carrying out pre-authorized business on behalf of the Association, shall be paid by the Association, subject to such policies as may be implemented by the Board of Directors from time to time.

14.0 PROFESSIONAL RINGS

Only Applied Science Technologists and Certified Technicians in good standing may wear or display the Association ring. Members removed from the register shall forfeit any implied or given right to wear or display the professional ring and must be returned to the Association office within fourteen (14) days upon written request from the Registrar. The professional ring issued to Applied Science Technologists and Certified Technicians shall remain the property of the Association. In the event a person ceases to remain a member-in-good standing or is suspended from the Association, the professional ring must be returned upon written request from the Registrar.

15.0 SPECIAL MEETINGS AND NOTICES

15.1 Notice of Meetings

Notice of meetings of the Association shall be sent by ordinary mail, facsimile, or electronic mail to the address or facsimile/electronic mailing address shown in the records of the Association at least fifteen (15) days before the holding of the meeting, designating the time and place, or may be published in a newsletter or newspaper(s) having general circulation in the Province at least thirty (30) days before the holding of the meeting.

15.2 Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Association shall be convened by order of the Board of Directors or by written request signed by any twenty (20) Applied Science Technologists or Certified Technicians, at such time and place as determined by the Board of Directors and in no case later than forty-five (45) days following receipt of such written notice. Upon request for a special meeting of the Association, such notice shall specify the nature of the proposed business to be transacted at such meeting and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting or any adjournment thereof.
