NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that effective 12:00 Midnight on March 15 to 12:00 Midnight on November 15 each year until 2015:

This restriction will also be in effect from the period commencing on November 16 in one year and ending on March 1 of the following year and when the ambient temperature is above -6°C as reported at the Town of Nipawin.

This Order does not permit the weight on any axle, axle group or vehicle from exceeding the secondary highway weights prescribed in *The Vehicle Weight and Dimension Regulations, 1999* for that axle, axle group or vehicle.

This Order is issued on a permanent basis and should not be confused with Spring Road Restriction Orders.

This Order No. 40/06, being an order governing the management of risk, shall be referred to as the *Risk Management Order*.

**I. Definitions**

**1** In this Order:

(a) “**inspector**” means a person authorized by the Minister, pursuant to s.s.40(1) of the *Agri-Food Act, 2004*, or any amendments thereto, to make any inspection, investigation or inquiry for the purpose of administering and enforcing the *Agri-Food Act, 2004*, the *Commercial Egg Marketing Plan Regulations* or any order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, the Minister, the Agri-Food Council or of the Saskatchewan Egg Producers;

(b) “**CEMA inspector**” means a person authorized by the Canadian Egg Marketing Agency (“CEMA”) to assess production facilities in terms of the degree of fulfillment of the terms and requirements of the CEMA “Start Clean Stay Clean™” (SCSC) program;

(c) “**production facility**” means the buildings and equipment used to house and maintain egg laying hens (“layers”) and manage the egg production and market the eggs, including but not limited to the barn(s), and the buildings and equipment to collect, package, store and ship the eggs;

(d) “**S.e. positive**” means the presence of the bacteria *Salmonella enteritidis* (“S.e.”);

(e) “**S.e. negative**” means the absence of the bacteria *S.e.*;

(f) “**S.e. sampling**” and “**S.e. sample**” mean, respectively, the process of taking samples in accordance with this Order for the purposes of testing for the presence or absence of the bacteria *S.e.*, and a sample taken in accordance with the provisions of this Order for the purposes of testing for the presence or absence of the bacteria *S.e.*;

(g) “**table egg market**” means those outlets and purchasers purchasing eggs for consumption in the shell including, but not restricted to: end consumers, wholesalers, graders and retailers.

**II. Classification or Grading of Eggs**

**2** The SEP shall classify or grade all eggs, other than broiler hatching eggs, produced by a registered producer, in terms of their risk of contamination by the bacteria *S.e.*

**3** The risk of contamination by *S.e.* shall be determined by the presence or absence of *S.e.* in the production facility wherein the eggs are produced. If *S.e.* is present in the production facility, it shall be identified as *S.e.* positive. If *S.e.* is not present in the production facility, it shall be identified as *S.e.* negative.

**4** Eggs produced in a production facility that has been identified as *S.e.* positive shall be classed or graded as “high risk”.

**5** Eggs produced in a production facility that has been identified as *S.e.* negative shall be classed or graded as “low risk”.

**6** Eggs produced in a production facility to which an inspector has been denied access or entry for the purpose of *S.e.* sampling shall be classed or graded as “uninspected”.

**III. Testing for S.e. Contamination**

**7** Identification of the presence of *S.e.* in a production facility shall be determined by sampling the production facility and testing the samples for the presence of *S.e.* contamination. Sampling the production facility for the presence of *S.e.* contamination shall be done by inspectors authorized by the Minister and conducted in accordance with the protocols of Schedule 1 to this Order. Testing the samples for the presence of *S.e.* contamination shall be done by a laboratory accredited by the Standards Council of Canada.

**8** Inspectors may sample the production facility or facilities of registered producers for the presence of *S.e.*

**9** No one shall deny an inspector immediate and unimpeded access or entry to a production facility for the purpose of *S.e.* sampling in accordance with this Order.

**10** An inspector may sample a production facility at any reasonable time and with any frequency considered reasonably necessary to manage the risk of *S.e.* contamination.

**11** A production facility with multiple buildings or multiple flocks, which are located on the same or contiguous land descriptions, and which are linked by a network of transport belts or are sheltered within a single structure, shall be deemed a single production facility.

**12** A production facility with multiple buildings or multiple flocks, which are located on the same or contiguous land descriptions, and which use the same packaging and transport facilities, shall be deemed a single production facility.

**13** A producer may apply to the SEP for waiver or modification of the provisions of s.11 and 12 of this Order, which determine whether the producer’s production facility is deemed a single production facility, and the SEP, in its absolute discretion and on a case by case basis, may approve or deny such a request.

**14** If *S.e.* contamination is found in any one component of a single production facility the entire production facility, and each of its components, shall be identified as *S.e.* positive.

**15** If a production facility is identified as *S.e.* positive, the SEP shall promptly notify the producer, the grader, CEMA and any other person or party which SEP considers necessary or advisable to notify.

**IV. Disposition of Eggs From An S.e. Positive Production Facility**

**16** No eggs from a production facility that has been identified as *S.e.* positive, and no eggs that have been classed or graded as uninspected, may be marketed to the table egg market.

**17** Eggs from a production facility that is identified as *S.e.* positive, and eggs that have been classed or graded as uninspected, may be diverted to a breaking facility for pasteurization.

18 If the producer operating a production facility that is identified as *S.e.* positive is currently participating in the CEMA SCSC program, and the producer chooses to divert its eggs to a breaking facility, the diverted eggs will be incorporated into the Industrial Products Program. In this case, if the producer has a SCSC score of 90 or higher as of the date of the positive *S.e.* test result, the diverted eggs will be priced at the provincial producer price. If the producer has a SCSC score of less than 90, the diverted eggs will be priced as the product derived by multiplying the provincial producer price for the grade in question and the SCSC score expressed as a percentage. For greater clarity, the following example will demonstrate the pricing principle: if the producer SCSC score is 80, and the Saskatchewan Grade A Large producer price is \$1.50 per dozen, then the producer shall receive 80% of \$1.50 = \$1.20 per dozen for Grade A Large eggs diverted to the breaker; and similarly for other grades and sizes.

19 If the producer operating a production facility that is identified as *S.e.* positive is not currently participating in the CEMA SCSC program or does not have a SCSC score which has been delivered within the most recent twelve months, and the producer chooses to divert its eggs to a breaking facility, the diverted eggs shall not be incorporated into the Industrial Products Program.

20 If a production facility is identified as *S.e.* positive, and the producer chooses to depopulate the production facility, the SEP will endeavour to work with the producer and with CEMA so as to facilitate compensation from CEMA for the producer according to the terms and conditions of CEMA's *S.e.* Downtime Compensation Policy.

21 If a production facility is identified as *S.e.* positive and the producer has a SCSC score of 90 or higher as of the date of the positive *S.e.* test result, and the producer chooses to depopulate the production facility, the SEP will compensate the producer at the rate per dozen that is equal to the difference between the CEMA cost of production per dozen and the Saskatchewan provincial producer price per dozen – expressed on a Grade A Large basis – for the number of dozens determined by CEMA pursuant to the terms of its compensation program to be equivalent to the number of hens depopulated (“the equivalent dozens”). For greater clarity, the following example will demonstrate this case: if the provincial Grade A Large producer price is \$1.50 per dozen, and the CEMA formula cost of production for Saskatchewan is \$1.49, then the Saskatchewan Egg Producers shall remit an additional \$0.01 per dozen to the producer for the equivalent dozens as determined by CEMA.

#### V. Remedies

22 If eggs from a production facility have been classed or graded as uninspected pursuant to s.6 of this Order, due to a denial of access or entry to an inspector to that facility, *those eggs may be delivered to the table egg market* if and only if unimpeded access and entry to that production facility is granted to an inspector for the purposes of *S.e.* sampling in accordance with this Order.

23 Subject to s.24, if a production facility is identified as *S.e.* positive, and the producer chooses to divert the eggs from that facility to a breaking facility, that production facility will only be identified as *S.e.* negative if:

- (a) the production facility has been assessed by a CEMA inspector according to the standards of CEMA's SCSC program;
- (b) the CEMA inspector has ranked the production facility at a score of 90 or higher on the SCSC program scale; and
- (c) negative results are obtained in each of three consecutive *S.e.* samplings and tests of the facility, each of which is conducted at least one week later than the prior test.

24 A producer may apply to the SEP for waiver or modification of the conditions set out in cl.23(a) to (c) of this Order and the SEP, in its absolute discretion and on a case by case basis, may approve or deny such a request.

25 If a production facility has been identified as *S.e.* positive, and the producer chooses to depopulate the facility, that production facility shall be identified as *S.e.* negative if:

- (a) the production facility has been assessed by a CEMA inspector according to the standards of CEMA's SCSC program; and
- (b) the CEMA inspector has ranked the production facility at a score of 90 or higher on the SCSC program scale; and
- (c) prior to repopulation, the facility is sampled and tested for the presence of *S.e.* and the test yields negative results.

26 Once a production facility which has been identified as *S.e.* positive has been subsequently identified, pursuant to the provisions of this Order, as *S.e.* negative, eggs produced from that production facility shall be classed or graded as “low risk” and may be marketed to the table egg market.

#### SCHEDULE 1 S.E. TESTING PROTOCOLS

##### Sampling Locations

The sites to be sampled shall be divided into two types of locations:

- Egg contact areas, including but not limited to: plastic trays; egg collection cart(s); the egg packer; conveyors and belts; elevator(s); and rollouts including mesh and bumpers;
- The barn environment, including but not limited to: cage bottoms; ceiling, floors and walls; ventilation intakes and fan exhausts; tops of water pipes; feeding trough elbows; doorway perimeters; and all other areas of the barn environment.

##### Number of Sites to be Sampled

- Within each barn a minimum of sixty (60) sites is to be sampled. This will include one pooled sample of 30 or more sites from the egg contact areas, and one pooled sample of 30 or more sites from the barn environment;
- A barn is considered to be a distinct enclosed layer housing unit. In other words, if for example two such enclosed layer housing units are incorporated into a single building structure, that building structure is considered to incorporate two barns, and each of those barns shall be sampled with a minimum of sixty (60) sites, for a total of one hundred twenty (120) sites for the entire building structure;
- Samples are to be taken from widely separated areas selected from the detailed list of sampling locations for each of the two types of sampling locations.

**Nature of Samples**

Samples are to be drawn from the following types of sampling material, without limitation:

- Dust, fluff or scrapings
- Feathers
- Egg spillage
- Insect carcasses
- Feathers
- Cobwebs
- Rodent droppings

**Procedure of Sample Collection**

• Inspectors may make reference to, and may be guided by, the procedure for sample collection set out in s. 6.7 of the CEMA National Microbiological Sampling Protocol for Shell Egg Production Units (attached). However, inspectors are not limited to, or restrained by, that procedure and a failure to strictly follow that procedure, or any of the steps therein, does not invalidate the result of any testing of samples or invalidate any of the actions of the inspector;

• Similarly, inspectors may make reference to, and may be guided by, the CEMA Field Operations Protocol – Sanitary Procedures (attached). However, inspectors are not limited to, or restrained by, that protocol and a failure to strictly follow it, or any of the steps therein, does not invalidate the result of any testing of samples or invalidate any of the actions of the inspector.

**Shipping: Container & Transportation**

- Samples are to be placed and sealed in a sterile plastic bag;
- The samples are to be separated and pooled according to the source of the sample: one bag will contain samples taken from egg contact areas, one bag will contain samples taken from the barn environment, and one will contain rodent droppings and insect carcasses;
- The pooled samples in the separate bag are to be placed in an envelope with an *S.e.* test submission form documenting the producer number, the flock number, the date the test was taken, and the name of the inspector. The form is to be obtained from the SEP Office;
- The envelope is sent to the SEP Office, where the information on the label is to be documented. The SEP Office is to then forward the envelope to the accredited laboratory by courier.

**POLICIES OF THE SEP**

**1** The SEP shall endeavour to arrange for an inspector to sample each production facility at least once in each production cycle, in the second half of the production cycle.

**2** The SEP shall endeavour to arrange for an inspector to sample each free range or free run production facility at least twice annually, unless the free run operation incorporates slats or wire in the floor of the barn(s).

PRESCRIPTION REVIEW PROGRAM  
BYLAW AMENDMENTS

**Bylaw 40 is rescinded and the following substituted in its place:**

**“40 The Prescription Review Program**

(1) Panel of Monitored Drugs – The prescription review program shall apply to all dosage forms of the following drugs, except where indicated otherwise:

ACETAMINOPHEN WITH CODEINE – in all dosage forms except those containing 8 mg or less of codeine

ACETYLSALICYLIC ACID (ASA) WITH CODEINE – in all dosage forms except those containing 8 mg or less of codeine

AMPHETAMINES – in all dosage forms

ANABOLIC STEROIDS

ANILERIDINE – in all dosage forms

BARBITUATES

BENZODIAZEPINES – in all doses and forms

BUTALBITAL – in all dosage forms

BUTALBITAL WITH CODEINE – in all dosage forms

BUTORPHANOL

CHLORAL HYDRATE

COCAINE – in all dosage forms

CODEINE – as the single active ingredient, or in combination with other active ingredients, in all dosage forms except those containing 20 mg per 30 ml or less of codeine in liquid for oral administration

DIETHYLPROPION – in all dosage forms

FENTANYL – in all dosage forms

HYDROCODONE-DIHYDROCODEINONE – in all dosage forms

HYDROMORPHONE-DIPHRYDROMORPHONE – in all dosage forms

LEVORPHANOL – in all dosage forms

MEPERIDINE-PETHIDINE - in all dosage forms

METHADONE – in all dosage forms

METHYLPHENIDATE – in all dosage forms

MORPHINE – in all dosage forms

NORMETHANDONE-P-HYDROXYEPHEDRINE – in all dosage forms

OXYCODONE – as the single active ingredient, or in combination with other active ingredients in all dosage forms

PANTOPON – in all dosage forms

PENTAZOCINE – in all dosage forms

PHENTERMINE – in all dosage forms

PROPOXYPHENE - in all dosage forms

(2) Prescriptions for drugs covered by the Prescription Review Program shall be issued by physicians according to the policies and procedures agreed to and amended from time to time by the College of Dental Surgeons of Saskatchewan, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Registered Nurses Association and the Saskatchewan College of Pharmacists.

(3) In order to prescribe a drug to which the prescription review program applies, physicians shall complete a written prescription which meets federal and provincial legal requirements and includes the following:

- (a) a statement that the prescription is only valid for three days;
- (b) the patient's date of birth;
- (c) the patient's address;
- (d) the total quantity of medication prescribed, both numerically and in written form;
- (e) the patient's health services number; and
- (f) the prescriber's name and address.

(4) Physicians shall only prescribe part-fills of medications to which the prescription review program applies if the following information is specified in the prescription:

- (a) the total quantity;
- (b) the amount to be dispensed each time; and
- (c) the time interval between fills.

(5) The office of the Registrar may gather and analyze information pertaining to the prescribing of medications to which the prescription review program applies in Saskatchewan for the purpose of limiting the inappropriate prescribing and inappropriate use of such drugs. In order to fulfill that role, the office of the Registrar may, among other activities:

- (a) generally, provide education to physicians in order to encourage appropriate prescribing practices by physicians registered by the College;
- (b) alert physicians to possible inappropriate use of medications to which the prescription review program applies by patients to whom they have prescribed such drugs;
- (c) alert physicians to possible inappropriate prescribing of medications to which the prescription review program applies;
- (d) make recommendations to a physician with respect to the physician's prescribing of medications to which the prescription review program applies;
- (e) require physicians to provide explanations for their prescribing of medications to which the prescription review program applies. In making requests for explanations, the office of the Registrar may require the physician to provide information about the patient, the reasons for prescribing to the patient, and any knowledge which the physician may have about other narcotics or controlled drugs received by the patient;
- (f) cause information, concerns or opinions of general application to the profession to be communicated to the physicians registered by the College without identifying the particular physician to whom such information relates;

(g) provide information gathered in connection with the Prescription Review Program to another health professional body including the College of Dental Surgeons of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan College of Pharmacists or the Saskatchewan Registered Nurses' Association, provided the information gathered is required by that body to perform and carry out the duties of that health professional body pursuant to an Act with respect to regulating the profession. Where the personal health information relates to a member of the health professional body seeking disclosure, disclosure by the Registrar of that information may only be made in accordance with The Health Information Protection Act, and in particular subsection 27(5) of that Act;

(6) Physicians shall respond to such requests for explanation, as described in paragraph 5(e) above, from the office of the Registrar within 14 days of receipt of such a request for information.

(7) The Registrar, Deputy Registrar, or Prescription Review Program Supervisor may extend the deadline for reply at their discretion, upon receipt of a written request for extension from the physician.

(8) All physicians who receive such a request for information will comply, to the best of their ability, fully and accurately with such request for information.

(9) Failure to comply with paragraphs 40(5)(e), 40(6) and 40(8) above is unbecoming, improper, unprofessional or discreditable conduct".

**EXTRACTS FROM THE RULES AND  
PROCEDURES OF THE LEGISLATIVE  
ASSEMBLY OF SASKATCHEWAN  
RELATING TO PRIVATE BILLS**

**PETITIONS**

**12(1)** A petition to the Assembly may be presented by a Member at any time during the sitting of the Assembly by filing the same with the Clerk of the Assembly.

(6) Petitions may be either written or printed, provided always that when there are three or more petitioners, the signatures of at least three petitioners shall be subscribed on the sheet containing the prayer of the petition.

(9) No petition can be received which prays for any expenditure, grant or charge on the public revenue, whether payable out of the Consolidated Fund or out of moneys to be provided by the Assembly.

NOTE: *A form of Petition can be obtained on application to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly.*

**PRIVATE BILLS**

**64(1)** All petitions for Private Bills shall be in duplicate and shall be filed with the Clerk of the Assembly not later than the twentieth sitting day of the Session.

(2) No petition for any Private Bill shall be received by the Assembly if presented after the first twenty-five sitting days of the Session.

(3) No Private Bill may be introduced in the Assembly after the first thirty sitting days of the Session.

**65(1)** Every applicant for a Private Bill shall deposit with the Clerk of the Assembly along with the petition for same, two copies of the bill, with marginal notes inserted, and an accepted cheque payable to the Minister of Finance for the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, if the said bill does not exceed ten pages, and fifteen dollars additional for each page over that number, four hundred and fifty words shall be held to constitute a page.

(2) In the case of a bill incorporating a company, a receipt from the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies for any statutory fees required shall also be deposited with the Clerk of the Assembly.

**66** No remittance of a deposit on account of a Private Bill or any portion thereof shall be ordered by the Assembly unless the same has been recommended by the committee charged with its consideration, or unless the bill has been withdrawn, rejected or not reported upon, in which cases the actual expenses incurred shall be deducted from the deposit received before making such remittance.

**68(1)** All petitions to the Legislature for Private Bills of any nature whatsoever, shall require a notice, clearly and distinctly specifying the nature and object of the application and where the same refers to any proposed work, indicating generally the location of the work, and signed by and on behalf of the petitioners, with the address of the party signing the same; and when the petition is for an act of incorporation the name of the proposed company shall be stated in the notice.

(2) Such notice shall be published prior to the filing of the petition with the Clerk of the Assembly as required in Rule 64(1) in two consecutive issues of *The Saskatchewan Gazette* and four consecutive issues of a newspaper, published in English and having circulation in the locality affected.

(3) A copy of the notice with a statutory declaration of the several publications of advertisement shall be filed with the Clerk of the Assembly along with the petition and bill.

**69(2)** Every bill for an act of incorporation, where a form of model bill has been adopted, shall be drawn in accordance with such model bill, copies of which may be obtained from the Clerk of the Assembly. Any provisions contained in any such bill which are not in accord with the model bill shall be inserted between brackets and shall be so printed.

**72** When any bill for confirming any agreement is filed with the Clerk of the Assembly a true copy of such agreement must be attached to it.

#### COMMITTEE RULING

In cases where the proposed bill provides that the property to be used or occupied by the petitioner be exempt from taxation, either in whole or in part, the petitioner must file with the Clerk of the Assembly, along with the petition, a written statement from the local municipal authority in which the said property is situated approving the intent of the provisions of the proposed bill which provide for the exemption from taxation.

The name of the Member who is to present the petition and Private Bill must be furnished to the Clerk of the Assembly at the time of filing the petition. Such Member should not, of course, be a Member of the Cabinet.
