SASKATCHEWAN REGULATIONS 101/2008

The Traffic Safety Act

Section 287

Order in Council 737/2008, dated October 22, 2008

(Filed October 23, 2008)

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Driver Licensing and Suspension Amendment Regulations*, 2008.

R.R.S. c.T-18.1 Reg 2 amended

2 The Driver Licensing and Suspension Regulations, 2006 are amended in the manner set forth in these regulations.

Section 2 amended

- 3 Clause 2(1)(b) is repealed and the following substituted:
 - "(b) 'addictions counsellor' means a person who:
 - (i) is employed as an addictions counsellor by a regional health authority governed by *The Regional Health Services Act*;
 - (ii) is working as an addictions counsellor under contract to a regional health authority governed by *The Regional Health Services Act*; or
 - (iii) in the opinion of the administrator, is qualified to provide services as an addictions counsellor".

Section 11 amended

4 The following subsection is added after subsection 11(5):

"(5.1) Subject to subclause 2(1)(i)(ii), no Class 2, 3, 4, 5 or 7 driver's licence permits its holder operate a truck that is towing a vehicle or combination of vehicles where the combined gross weight of the vehicles being towed is in excess of 4 600 kilograms unless the licence bears an endorsement permitting the holder of the licence to do so".

Section 21 amended

- 5 The following clauses are added after clause 21(2)(c):
 - "(d) Intoxilyzer 8000 C;
 - "(e) DataMaster DMT-C".

New section 30.1

6 Section 30.1 is repealed and the following substituted:

"Specified period for subsequent convictions - section 142 of Act and sections 39 and 40.1 of regulations

- **30.1**(1) In this section, **'specified date'** means:
 - (a) the date of the conviction; or
 - (b) if the court delays sentencing pursuant to subsection 720(2) of the *Criminal Code*, the date of sentencing.

- (2) For the purposes of section 142 of the Act and sections 39 and 40.1 of these regulations, **'specified period'** means:
 - (a) for the year in which this section comes into force, the period that is seven years before the specified date;
 - (b) for the year commencing on January 1, 2008, the period that is eight years before the specified date;
 - (c) for the year commencing on January 1, 2009, the period that is nine years before the specified date;
 - (d) for the year commencing on January 1, 2010 and for each subsequent year, the period that is 10 years before the specified date".

Section 36 amended

7 Clause 36(d) is amended by striking out "section 209.1 or".

Section 38 amended

- 8 Subsection 38(2) is repealed and the following substituted:
- "(2) An application pursuant to this section may be made:
 - (a) in the case of a disqualification described in clause 141(3)(a) of the Act, six months after the date of sentencing for the conviction that resulted in the disqualification;
 - (b) in the case of a disqualification described in clause 141(3)(b) of the Act, 18 months after the date of sentencing for the conviction that resulted in the disqualification;
 - (c) in the case of a disqualification described in clause 141(3)(c) of the Act, 30 months after the date of sentencing for the conviction that resulted in the disqualification;
 - (d) in the case of a disqualification described in clause 141(3)(d) of the Act, 30 months after the date of sentencing for the conviction that resulted in the disqualification; and
 - (e) in no case before the expiration of any order of prohibition made pursuant to section 259 of the *Criminal Code*".

 - "(b) the expiry of:
 - (i) in the case of a first offence pursuant to either of those provisions, three months after the date of sentencing for the conviction;
 - (ii) in the case of a second offence within the specified period, six months after the date of sentencing for the current conviction; or
 - (iii) in the case of a third or subsequent offence within the specified period, 12 months after the date of sentencing for the current conviction".
- (3) Subsection 39(7) is repealed.

Section 40.1 amended

- 10 Subsection 40.1(2) is amended:
 - (a) by repealing subclause (a)(i) and substituting the following:
 - "(i) one year from the date of sentencing for the conviction";
 - (b) by repealing subclause (b)(i) and substituting the following:
 - "(i) two years from the date of sentencing for the second conviction"; and
 - (c) by repealing subclause (c)(i) and substituting the following:
 - "(i) three years from the date of sentencing for the last conviction".

 - (iii) \$2.4393 per kilogram of other solids;

- "(o) in the case of class 5c milk:
 - (i) \$3.7595 per kilogram of butterfat;
 - (ii) \$2.1413 per kilogram of protein;
 - (iii) \$2.1413 per kilogram of other solids".

Section 77.28

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Consumer Protection Amendment Regulations*, 2008.

R.R.S. c.C-30.1 Reg 2, new Part VII.1

2 The Consumer Protection Regulations, 2007 are amended by adding the following Part after Part VII:

"PART VII.1 Prepaid Purchase Cards

"Exemption - where nothing of value provided for prepaid purchase card

- **40.1**(1) The prohibition set out in section 77.13 of the Act does not apply to a person who issues a prepaid purchase card to a consumer in the following circumstances:
 - (a) when the prepaid purchase card is issued for a charitable purpose;
 - (b) when the consumer provides nothing of value for the prepaid purchase card.
- (2) Section 77.15 of the Act does not apply to a person who issues a prepaid purchase card to a consumer in the following circumstances:
 - (a) when the prepaid purchase card is issued for a charitable purpose;
 - (b) when the consumer provides nothing of value for the prepaid purchase card.

"Exemption - replacement of plastic card or written certificate

- **40.2** A person may issue or sell a prepaid purchase card that has an expiry date provided that:
 - (a) the expiry date applies only to the plastic card or written certificate;
 - (b) the balance, if any, remaining on the prepaid purchase card does not expire; and
 - (c) if there is a remaining balance on the prepaid purchase card, the issuer or seller:
 - (i) replaces the plastic card or written certificate with a new plastic card or written certificate in the amount of that balance; and
 - (ii) in accordance with section 77.15 of the Act, does not charge any fees to the holder of the prepaid purchase card for replacing the plastic card or written certificate as provided in subclause (i).

"Permitted fees

- **40.3** A person who issues or sells a prepaid purchase card may charge the following fees in relation to the prepaid purchase card:
 - (a) a fee for replacing a lost or stolen prepaid purchase card;
 - (b) a fee for customizing the prepaid purchase card.

"Disclosure

- **40.4**(1) At the time a prepaid purchase card is issued or sold, the issuer or seller must provide the consumer with the following information:
 - (a) a description of all restrictions, limitations and conditions that the issuer or seller imposes on the use of the prepaid purchase card, including any permitted fee or expiry date;
 - (b) a description of the way in which the consumer can obtain information respecting the prepaid purchase card, including any remaining balance.
- (2) The issuer or seller of a prepaid purchase card must provide the consumer with the information required by subsection (1) in a clear manner and in a way likely to bring it to the consumer's attention".

Coming into force

- **3**(1) Subject to subsection (2), these regulations come into force on the day on which section 1 of *The Consumer Protection Amendment Act*, 2008 comes into force.
- (2) If these regulations are filed with the Registrar of Regulations after the coming into force of section 1 of *The Consumer Protection Amendment Act, 2008*, these regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations.
