REVISED REGULATIONS OF SASKATCHEWAN

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATIONS 105/2015

The Gas Inspection Act, 1993

Section 35

Order in Council 563/2015, dated December 2, 2015

(Filed December 3, 2015)

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as The Gas Inspection Amendment Regulations, 2015.

R.R.S. c.G-3.2 Reg 1 amended

2 The Gas Inspection Regulations are amended in the manner set forth in these regulations.

Section 13.1 amended

3 Section 13.1 is amended by striking out "\$250" and substituting "\$2,500".

New section 16

4 Section 16 is repealed and the following substituted:

"Standards for installations

- **16**(1) A person who installs equipment or apparatus that uses natural gas or propane as a fuel shall install the equipment or apparatus in accordance with the standard CSA-B149.1-15: *Natural gas and propane installation code*, as amended from time to time.
- (2) A person who installs equipment or apparatus that stores or handles propane shall install the equipment or apparatus in accordance with the standard CSA-B149.2-15: *Propane storage and handling code*, as amended from time to time.
- (3) A person who installs digester gas systems that use methane as a fuel shall install the systems in accordance with the standard CSA-149.6-15: *Code for biogas generation and utilization*, as amended from time to time.
- (4) A person who installs vehicle refuelling appliances without storage facilities shall install the appliances in accordance with the standard CSA-B108-14: *Compressed natural gas fuelling stations installation code*, as amended from time to time.
- (5) A person who installs fuel-related components on appliances and equipment in the field shall install the components in accordance with the standard CSA-B149.3-15: Code for the field approval of fuel-related components on appliances and equipment, as amended from time to time.
- (6) A person who installs equipment or apparatus that uses hydrogen as a fuel or that stores or handles hydrogen shall install the equipment or apparatus in accordance with the standard CAN/BNQ/1784-000/2007: Canadian Hydrogen Installation Code, as amended from time to time, approved by the Standards Council of Canada.

(7) A person who installs propane fuel system components or containers on motor vehicles for the provision of motive power or for fuel purposes other than motive power shall install the components in accordance with the standard CSA-B149.5-15: *Installation code for propane fuel systems and containers on motor vehicles*, as amended from time to time".

Coming into force

5 These regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations.

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATIONS 106/2015

The Provincial Sales Tax Act

Section 44

Order in Council 564/2015, dated December 2, 2015

(Filed December 3, 2015)

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Provincial Sales Tax Amendment Regulations*, 2015.

R.R.S. c.E-3 Reg 1, new section 18.4

2 The Provincial Sales Tax Regulations are amended by adding the following section after section 18.3:

"Exemption re feminine hygiene products

18.4(1) In this section:

- (a) **'federal regulations'** means the *Deduction for Provincial Rebate (GST/HST) Regulations* made pursuant to the *Excise Tax Act* (Canada);
- (b) **'feminine hygiene product'** means a feminine hygiene product as defined in section 1 of the federal regulations.
- (2) Persons who purchase a feminine hygiene product are exempt from paying tax on their purchases of those products".

Coming into force

3 These regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations but are retroactive and are deemed to have been in force on and from July 1, 2015.

SASKATCHEWAN REGULATIONS 107/2015

The Highways and Transportation Act, 1997

Section 69

Order in Council 565/2015, dated December 2, 2015

(Filed December 3, 2015)

Title

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Provincial Highway Designation (Regina Bypass) Amendment Regulations*, 2015.

R.R.S. c.H-3 Reg 17 amended

2 The Provincial Highway Designation Regulations, 1990 are amended in the manner set forth in these regulations.

New section 2

3 Section 2 is repealed and the following substituted:

"Interpretation

2 In these regulations, 'official highway map' means the Official Highway Map that appears in Part I of the Appendix and includes the Regina Bypass Official Highway Map that appears in Part II of the Appendix".

Section 3 amended

- 4(1) Subsection 3(1) is repealed and the following substituted:
- "(1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), the public highways shown on the official highway map under the heading "Provincial Highways" are designated as provincial highways".
- (2) Clause 3(2)(a) is repealed and the following substituted:
 - "(a) any portion that lies within the boundaries of a city except for any portion of the Regina Bypass shown in Part II of the Appendix that lies within the boundaries of the City of Regina".

New heading for Appendix

5 The following heading is added after section 5:


